Responding to Covid-19

At the very start of lock down in March 2020 Birchfield Big Local teamed up with two local social enterprises, Golden Sparkle CIC and Athac CIC, to distribute food to older residents and some families in the area. Most of the food came from the charity FareShare, who redistribute surplus food from the food industry. In addition there was fresh produce from Livingstone Road Community Allotment donated by Birchfield Residents Action Group. A team of volunteers packed and then delivered the food to residents once a week over a five month period.

In response to Covid-19 the Birchfield Big Local resident-led partnership set up a Health and Wellbeing group to think about what else could be done to address the health inequalities evident in the area.

The partnership funded eight projects over the summer to help address some of the health priorities. This included life and sports coaching sessions for young people; an online programme on managing diabetes; physical fitness and wellbeing sessions with walks in local green spaces; Grow Your Soup—helping families grow vegetables and herbs at home; and a one-to-one job club for residents aged 18 and over. All of the projects were led by local social enterprises.

The job club has continued and is now held online every Friday from 10am till 4pm. A voucher scheme has been set up with the help of a grant from the Covid Emergency Assistance Fund and a telephone befriending service—Birchfield Telephone Befriending Buddies—set up with a grant from the Neighbourhood Network Scheme.

Youth Celebrational Booklet

Russell Green, Birchfield Big Local Youth Worker, has been working with a core group of young people on the My Endz project. The group has just published a second booklet documenting the young people's journey over the past three years.

The booklet is a montage of pictures and young people's thoughts, feelings, and reflections on their experiences after participating in activities during the summer, autumn, winter, and spring breaks.

This past year has been momentous for all. There have been restrictions on what the group can do; yet this booklet is a celebration of the young people's growth, development and learning whilst with the Birchfield Big Local Youth team.

Birchfield Telephone Befriending Buddies

We have recently launched a new project called Birchfield Telephone Befriending Buddies.

The project provides a telephone befriending service for older adults (50+) living in Birchfield who are feeling, worried, lonely or are socially isolated, whether they are housebound due to health conditions or self-isolating during Covid-19.

Our aim is to connect with older adults from within the community through our telephone befriending service, help to reduce loneliness and social isolation, and help improve the wellbeing of people over the age of 50 years within the Birchfield area.

Once registered with us, a trained volunteer telephone befriending buddy, will check in and chat with you over the phone, once a week for 30 minutes or so. Your befriending buddy will develop and build a befriending relationship with you over the phone, by getting to know you, your interests and hobbies and provide a listening ear.

As a low-level telephone befriending service, regrettably we cannot provide higher level support for people who experience memory loss, dementia or have mental health conditions; as such this service may not be suitable for people who fall under these categories.



Birchfield Telephone Befriending Buddies is a FREE and Confidential telephone service for people aged 50+ within the Birchfield area, who are feeling worried, lonely or socially isolated, whether they are housebound due to health conditions or self isolating /shielding during the current pandemic.

Our friendly Volunteer Telephone Befriending Buddies, will call you once a week, for approx. 30mins to offer a listening ear and take an interest in your life. Once registered all you have to do is "grab a cuppa" and one of our befriending buddies will call you at an agreed date/time, to have a relaxed friendly chat.



Our service aims to help reduce, loneliness, social isolation and anxiety in the current pandemic and help improve wellbeing, amongst the over 50s, within the Birchfield area.

We aim to connect with older people from within the community, by providing a friendly Telephone Befriending Buddy who you can talk to over the phone, on a weekly basis for 30 mins, to share some time to chat with, about your interests and hobbies.

Important to note this is not a Counselling or Mentoring service. It is a telephone befriending service.

Who is eligible ?

- People who are aged 50+ yrs old
- Primarily for residents of the Birchfield area in Birmingham
- Must have their own landline or mobile number
- Must be able to hear, speak and be understood on the phone

As a low-level telephone befriending service, regrettably we cannot provide higher level support for people who experience memory loss, dementia, or have mental health conditions, as such this service may not be suitable for people who fall under these categories.



For food banks run by the Trussell Trust you will need to be referred by a doctor, health visitor, social worker, citizens advice etc and will be given a voucher that can be exchanged for at least 3 days emergency food. For other food banks no voucher is required.

Financial support

Local Welfare Provision (LWP)

www.birmingham.gov.uk/lwp Birmingham's Local Welfare Provision (LWP) scheme helps people in short-term crisis with food and essential items. People who receive help will not have to repay anything. It is not intended to replace the council's statutory duties.

Two types of payment are made:

Crisis payments to meet urgent needs such as essential food and/or clothing.

Community Support Grants to meet immediate needs for essential furniture or white goods to sustain housing needs and gain greater independence within the community.

You can either apply yourself or someone else can apply for you. You can only apply online – www.birmingham.gov.uk/lwp

Turn2us

The charity Turn2us helps people in financial need gain access to welfare benefits, charitable grants, and other financial help – online, by phone and face to face through partner organisations. The website includes an easy-to-use Benefits Calculator and Grants Search tools to check what benefits you might be able to claim and what grants you might be able to apply for.
